Import to Endnote

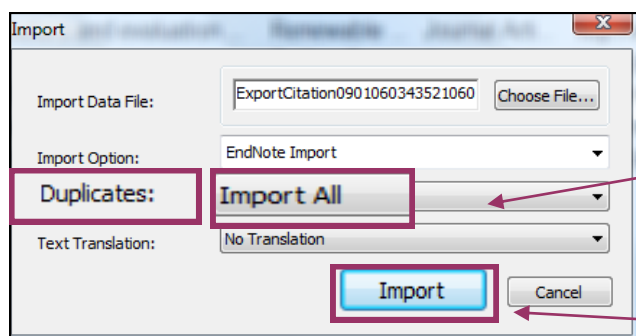
- 1 Open the Endnote library, e.g. *desertification.enl*, that you would like to import the records to. Then select from the top bar menu: **File > Import**



- 2 Choose the **txt file** that you have saved just now.



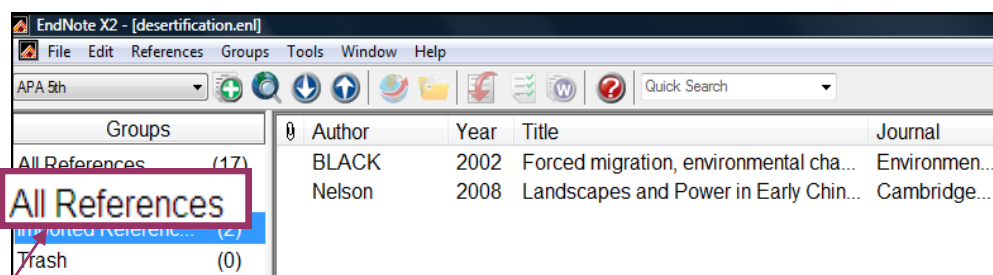
- 3 Choose **EndNote Import** as the **Import Option**



- 4 Select **Import All**.
Note: To remove identical records, select **Discard Duplicates**

- 5 Once all the options have been selected, click on **Import**.

- 6 Records will be imported into Endnote.



- 7 Click on **All References** under **Groups** to show all references in your library.
