



Go to Cochrane Library and retrieve your results


Go to Search In Cochrane Library, select Advanced Search for more search options.

From the result list, **check** those which you consider as relevant.




Then click on Export Selected Citations.

Save the results to a txt file


In Choose your export options window, select the preferred format from the options provided, then click on Export Citation.



When prompted to save your file. Click on Save.




You will be prompted to save the text file. Change the filename if needed. Then click on Save.





Import to Endnote


Open the Endnote library, e.g. *guide.enl*, that you would like to import the records to. Then select Import from the top bar menu: File > Import > File




Choose the **txt file** that you have saved just now.




Choose the appropriate filter. If Cochrane Library is not on the list, select Other Filters.



Select Import All.
Note: To remove identical records, select Discard Duplicates.



The records will be duly imported into the selected Endnote library.
