e.g. > *Berlin Crisis*

- 2 From the result list, **check** those which you consider as relevant.

- 3 Click on **Marked List**.


- 4 Select all items in Marked List.

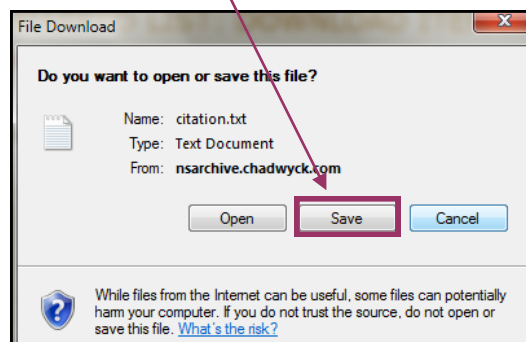
Note: when importing citations into EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager or RefWorks, you should select RIS format from the list of import filters.

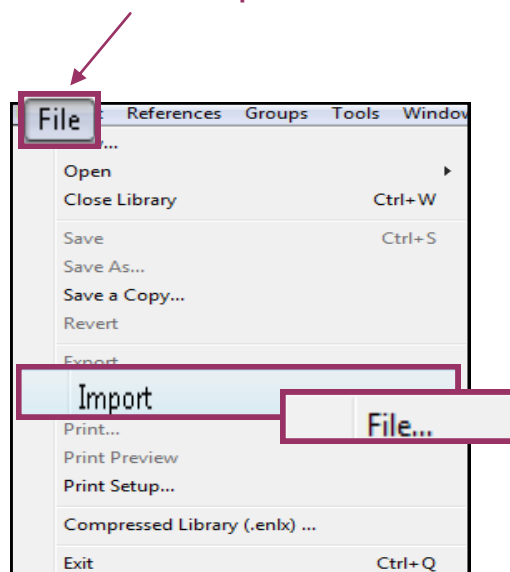
3 You will be prompted to save the file. Click on **Save.**

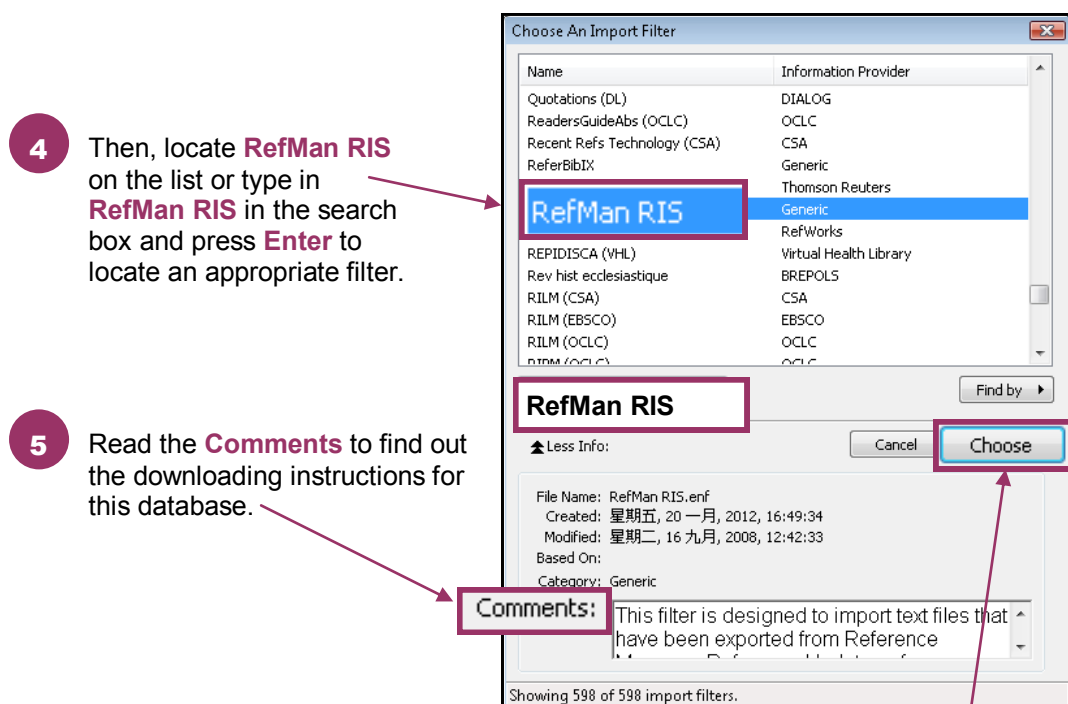
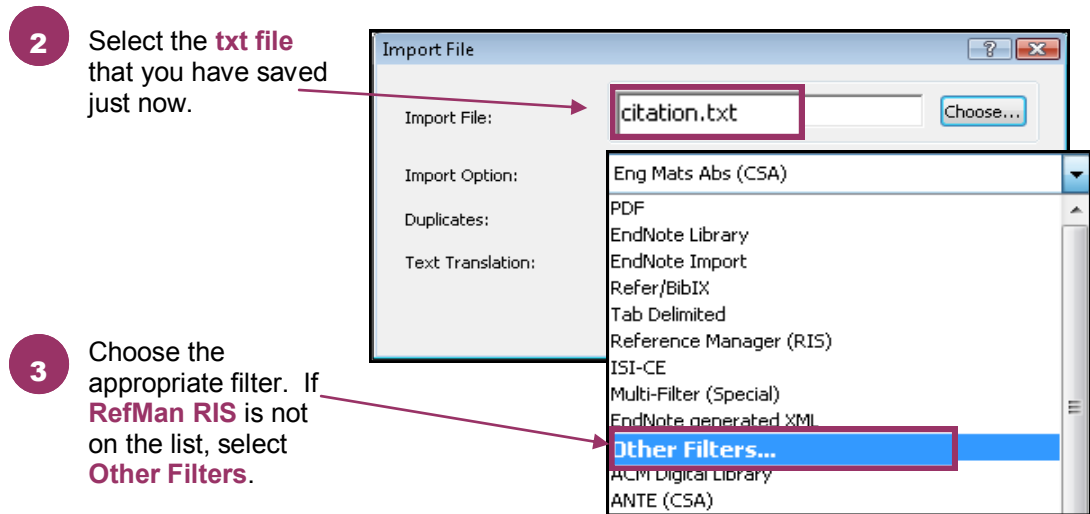

### Import to Endnote

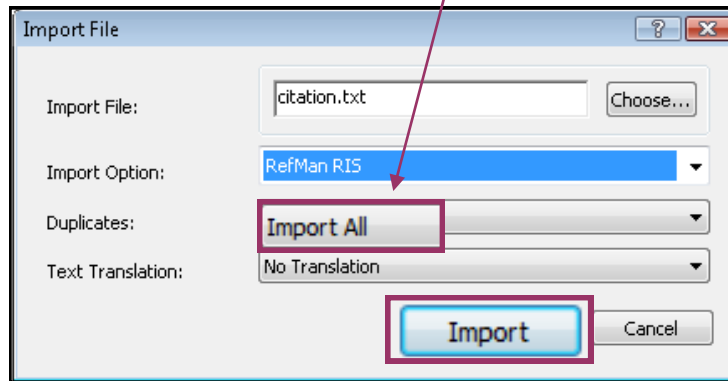
1 **Open** the Endnote library to import the txt file to Endnote. Select **Import** from the top bar menu: **File > Import > File**





**6** Then click on **Choose**.

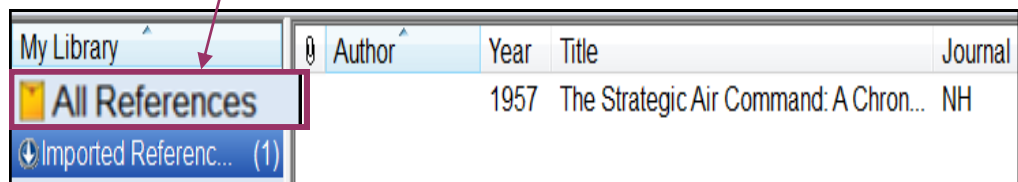
- 7** Select **Import All**.  
Note: To remove identical records, select **Discard Duplicates**



- 8** Once all the options have been selected, click on **Import**.

- 9** The records will be duly imported into the selected Endnote library.

- 10** Click on **All References** to show all references in your library.
