## Exploration of Shanxi & Beijing

This might be misleading when one solely read the title. It is not about an exploration team going to Beijing and Shanxi for any purposes. It is just some personal experiences I had during my exchange year in Beijing. Not being very familiar with China, I, as many others, have some false impressions about her. Even in Hong Kong, we focus on understanding more about China recently.
